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ADDING ASECTION

The exhibition is designed so you can expand and adapt it to your local context by adding local projects working with similar themes to the exhibition, with our add-on design template.

If you wish to include a local add-on of your own, you can chose any of the following options:


- A. DIY (Do it yourself): you can download our special design templates for local add-ons and fill in the templates yourself to create new posters. Send your posters by print@commonities.org for approval before printing.
- B. DIY with layout check: You can download and fill in the template yourself and purchase a layout check from our graphic designer.
- C. Full layout: You can purchase a full layout of your local add-ons from our graphic designer and send us all your material for layout.

ADD-ON SECTION

The Add-On section is used to exhibit local or regional projects in the form of:


- Country name and quote boards (X)
- Long Case Studies (B Boards)
- Short Case Studies (C Boards)
- An optional local sponsor board (Y)

The amount of case studies is not fixed and you can also choose to add previously displayed add-on sections from other places - refer to the download folder at www.kunst.dk/cc

PRINTING & SETTING UP

PRINTING

Format

The exhibition is designed for printing on A3 format (297x420mm) in portrait mode.


Bleed or no bleed

Depending on budget/available printers you can select to print with bleed on A3+ format and trim to A3 allowing ink to the edge of the paper or you can simply print directly to A3 - without bleed - and the printer will in most cases add a thin white frame around the edge of the page.

Materials

Print on at least 160gm coated paper or 120g uncoated paper. The coated paper can be made more durable by applying a silk or matte laminate. We encourage to select environmentally friendly FSC-certified paper.

SETTING UP

The Add-On section can be mounted anywhere within the exhibition, as long as it follows the basic rule of mounting as one complete section.

Prints can simply be mounted by pins, tape or wallpaper paste.


Prints can be mounted on foam or paperboards and non-permanent affixed to walls.

Start building your exhibition with 50cm space from the floor to your lowest print.

Use your prints as a grid to layout your exhibition. Build in sections with a minimum space of one print between sections.

Tip


- Start building 50 cm from floor
- Keep to a straight grid of pages
- Make sure to keep minimum space distance between sections



DESIGN ELEMENTS

COLOUR PALETTE

The Add-On section of the exhibition uses three different colours from the main sections of the exhibition. This creates an important visual difference.



TYPOGRAPHY - B BOARDS
