INTRODUCTION

AN OPEN SOURCE EXHIBITION

The exhibition is free to download and print. Our intention is that the exhibition can become a growing open source commons in itself, by accumulating and connecting new examples of artistic practices and projects about commons and communities.

READY TO PRINT

The exhibition is based on the commonly-shared A3 paper format, which makes it possible to print the exhibition locally depending on the context and resources available – whether you send it to a professional printer or use a simple office A3-printer.

To make it easy for you, the exhibition comes with a guide to print and setup as well as how to produce local add-ons.

The exhibition is ready to print, and we really hope that you will welcome this free initiative at your local institution or exhibition space. 


Sections

The exhibition is made-up from several sections:

- Exhibition titles (1 or 2)
- Preface, logo and QR code
- Sections (main):
 One "A board" with statement.
 Three to four "B boards"
 with large case studies.
 Four to five "C boards"
 with short case studies.
- Optional add-on section (local):
 A number of "B boards" with large case studies.
 A number of "C boards" with short case studies.
- An optional thank you board with local partner logos

SCALABILITY

There are four exhibition sizes: extra large, large, medium and small. You can increase the size of the exhibitions by adding extra local projects – see page 26.

All are printed on A3 or A3+.

Large exhibition

This format is suitable for large halls and other environments with plenty of space.

Dimensions: minimum 20 × 4m.

Medium exhibition


This format is suitable for large rooms with plenty of space.

Dimensions: minimum 16 × 3,4m.


Small exhibition

This format suitable for office spaces which has some space restrictions. Dimensions: minimum $11,3 \times 3,4m$.


Large Exhibition – (A3 portrait) (Dimensions W:22m × H:4m) (Min. 20m)



Medium Exhibition – (A3 portrait) (Dimensions W:16 × H:3,4m)



Small Exhibition – (A3 portrait) (Dimensions W:11,3 × H:3,4m)



Tip

The add-on local section(s) can be added by choosing additional boards from the archive or by producing new boards. See page 26.

FLOOR PLAN EXAMPLES

The exhibition is flexible and can be hung in one stretch or on different walls.


- Title (+ preface and logos)
- Sections
- Local add-on section


Tip

Exhibition title and preface should be placed near entrance.

By adding or removing distance between sections the exhibition can expand or decrease in size.

The exhibition can adapt to various spaces. I can wrap around corners, be placed on seperate walls or mounted on a single wall both indoor and outdoor.





SIZE GUIDE

THE EXHIBITION IS SCALABLE TO FIT VARIOUS EXHIBITION SPACES

LARGE EXHIBITION

Suitable for large halls and other environments with plenty of space. Use generous space between sections to make the exhibition spacious. As the exhibition is spread over a large area you can include multiple titles. Designed to be scalable, so can add section for local articles to your exhibition.

Large exhibition dimensions

Width: 22m (min. 20m)

Height: 4m

The exhibition consists of a preface section, 4 main sections and an optional add-on section displaying local cases.

Tip


Use two exhibition titles and place near entrances/initial view of the exhibition.

Place the titles high above the main viewing area to increase visibility.

Generous space between sections



MEDIUM EXHIBITION

Suitable for large halls and other environments with plenty of space. Designed to be scalable, so can add section for local articles to your exhibition.

Medium exhibition dimensions


Width: 16m (incl. add-on)

Height: 3,4m

Tip

Use only one title and position near the entrance/initial view of exhibition.

Minimum 1 A3 grid-space between sections



SMALL EXHIBITION

Suitable for office spaces which has some space restrictions.

In the "small exhibition" the C boards are removed from the exhibition to save space.

Small exhibition dimensions

Width: 11,3m (excl. add-on)

Height: 3,4m

Tip

Minimise space between sections to decrease the sice of the exhibition

Position the exhibition title near the entrance

Minimum 1 A3 grid-space between sections





PRINTING & SETTING UP

PRINTING

Format

The exhibition is designed for printing on A3 format (297x420mm) in portrait mode.


Bleed or no bleed

Depending on budget/available printers you can select to print with bleed on A3+ format and trim to A3 allowing ink to the edge of the paper or you can simply print directly to A3 - without bleed - and the printer will in most cases add a thin white frame around the edge of the page.

Materials

Print on at least 160gm coated paper or 120g uncoated paper. The coated paper can be made more durable by applying a silk or matte laminate. We encourage to select environmentally friendly FSC-certified paper.

SETTING UP

Prints can simply be mounted by pins, tape or wallpaper paste.

Prints can be mounted on foam or paperboards and non-permanent affixed to walls.

Start building your exhibition with 50cm space from the floor to your lowest print.

Use your prints as a grid to layout your exhibition. Build in sections with a minimum space of one print between sections.

As an aid when handling and setting up the prints all A and B prints are tagged with a number in the bottom left corner. The tag consist of a letter representing the type of board and a section number. Fx:

1-A (Section 1, A board)


4-B3 (Section 4, Third B board)

Tip

Start building 50 cm from floor

Keep to a straight grid of pages

Make sure to keep minimum space distance between sections
